Coca-Cola Night - Performance # 4 Results



Trevor Brazile, 5x World Champion All Around Cowboy, World Champion Tie-Down Roper, and World Champion Steer Roper, leads the tie-down roping average at the World's Oldest Rodeo®, with 21.5 seconds on two head.

The fine folks at Coca-Cola were honored at tonight's performance of the World's Oldest Rodeo®. Coca-Cola night may go down in the books as the toughest rodeo performance of the year.

Most of the top guns in the timed events were competing tonight, including the reigning and 5 time World Champion All Around cowboy, Trevor Brazile. Brazile, who is also the reigning World Champion Tie-Down Roper and Steer Roper, currently leads the tie-down roping average here at the World's Oldest Rodeo. Brazile made two great runs in the tie-down roping and team roping, but it was a Turquoise Circuit cowboy who put the heat on all the top guys, in the second round of competition.

Cimarron Thompson from Hobbs, N.M. was on his game tonight, making the fastest run of the entire rodeo, in both the steer wrestling, and the tie-down roping. His 4.9 second run placed him on the leader board among the best in the steer wrestling business. Without losing his momentum, Thompson was able to switch gears and focus on his tie-down roping, making an extremely fast 9.7 second run.

Other members of tonight's all-star cast included: Cutter Parsons, Joseph Parsons, Doug Pharr, Casey Branquinho, Stran Smith, Speed Williams, Allan Bach, Patrick Smith, Charly Crawford, Jhett Johnson, and Jessie Moody, all are Wrangler National Finalists, and some are World Champions.
