

Prescott Frontier Days®, Inc. 2024 Rodeo Parade

Rules & Regulations



Rules

1. The Rodeo parade is on Saturday, July 6, 2024, and begins promptly at 9:00 AM. Inclement weather could delay the parade's start time. Cancellation is unlikely.
2. Entry deadline: Entry form, entry fees, parade script, photo/sketch and participant waiver must be received by the Rodeo Parade Committee or in the Prescott Frontier Days® office by **Friday, May 17, 2024**. No late entry forms will be accepted after this date.
3. All entries are subject to the approval of the Rodeo Parade Committee. Entries that do not conform to these rules and regulations will be eliminated from consideration. Entry fees are non-refundable except for entries that are not approved by the Rodeo Parade Committee. The Rodeo Parade Committee reserves the right to limit the number of entries in the parade.
4. No entry is to stop at any time during the parade, including in front of the Judges' stand.
5. Each entry will maintain a maximum space of 25 ft. behind the entry in front of them during the parade. Parade stagers will walk with their assigned staging area along the parade route to assist entries and to maintain control. Parade Street Marshals will also be along the parade route to assist and maintain control.
6. Entries are limited to no more than 60 feet in length and up to 6 vehicles (a trailer counts as 1 vehicle). If allowed by the Rodeo Parade Committee, additional vehicles are \$25 per vehicle. Commercial entries are limited to 6 vehicles (a trailer counts as 1 vehicle). No more than 2 (two) large semi-trucks per entry will be allowed. All vehicles and float entries should be decorated.
7. No throwing anything to the parade spectators. Entries may walk along and hand items to the parade spectators.
8. NO discharging of any type of firearms.
9. All float entries must have fire extinguishers.
10. Participants standing on a float/vehicle must have something stable to hold on to for balance. Children must be seated at all times.
11. All children under the age of twelve (12) years must be accompanied by an adult.
12. Due to live overhead power lines, the maximum allowable height of entries is 13 feet 6 inches.
13. No alcoholic beverages or drugs are allowed in the staging areas or the parade route.

REGULATIONS

1. Your parade position and final details will be sent by email the week of June 12th. Information will be sent to the main contact person.
2. The main contact person signing the entry forms is responsible for notifying the group of the parade rules and regulations and is also responsible to notify the group of their entry number and staging location.
3. Advertising and identification of floats and themes should be in good taste. Controversial messages are not allowed; the Rodeo Parade Committee determines what's acceptable or controversial messages.
4. The staging areas open at 7:00 am and will be staffed with volunteers to help with parade preparation and to answer questions. All parade participants should be in their assigned staging area by 8:00 am. The parade starts promptly at 9:00 am.
5. If you want to be placed near a 2nd group or entry, let the Rodeo Parade Committee know in advance so they can accommodate your request.
6. The judges' stage is located at the intersection of Union and Cortez, across from the courthouse. Winners will be announced in the Sunday newspaper, and emails will be sent to all the parade winners. Parade awards may be picked up at the Rodeo Office starting July 10th, 9:00am to 4:00pm.

ANIMAL ENTRIES

1. Entries are limited to 20 animals (horses or other) per entry. Entries are responsible for cleaning up their staging areas prior to the parade. An additional fee of \$25 is charged for all animal entries to help offset the costs for manure clean up along the parade route.
2. For safety reasons, animals that are noise sensitive are not permitted in the parade.
3. All children under the age of twelve (12) riding on a horse **MUST** wear a protective helmet. No exceptions. Children under the age of twelve (12) will not be allowed to ride a horse alone during the parade; they must be accompanied by an adult walking or riding alongside.
4. Any entry pulled by a horse(s) must have an adult walking alongside or riding with the horse(s) to help control the horse(s) throughout the parade. A safety rope/out-rigging must be attached to the team lead to aid in stopping the team should it be necessary.
5. For safety reasons, only one (1) rider per horse.
6. All equine entrants should be familiar with Arizona Revised Statutes ARS 12-553 concerning limited liability of equine owners and owners of equine facilities.
7. Use Washington Street to park your trailers and do not block any driveways.
8. PLEASE BE RESPONSIBLE — Bring water for your animals. Clean up after your animals in staging area. Be considerate of private properties and do not allow your animals on sidewalks, businesses or personal property.

The rules & Regulations, participant waiver (Release & Waiver of Liability) agreement must be read, signed and agreed to by each parade entry and is incorporated by reference. Digital and faxed signatures are acceptable. Prescott frontier days®, Inc. will not be responsible if these rules are violated.
